

Editorial

The Rivers State University Journal of Education (RSUJOE) formally known as The Journal of Technical and Science Education (JOTASE) publishes twice a year. The Journal accepts academic articles of theoretical and empirical nature (qualitative and quantitative studies) on all matters relating to Education in general, but with emphasis on Adult Education and Community Development, Business Education, Educational Management, Foundations of Education, Mathematics Education, Science Education, Vocational and Technology Education, Library and Information Science and related disciplines.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS

- 1. Articles for consideration should be typed in Microsoft Word Document, Double-line spacing on a font type of New Time Roman, 12 point-size with normal border margin of one-inch all round, it should not be more than 6000 words notes and references inclusive, and should also have an Abstract of not more than 200 words. The author should identify five keywords from the paper immediately below the Abstract for accessing the paper on a web search. The paragraphing style should be indented with one tab in 0.5 inches (no block paragraphing please). Note that an abstract is necessarily important in any academic paper because it is the synopsis of the entire paper.
- 2. The article's title, author(s)' name(s) and affiliated institution/department and contact details (i.e phone number and email address) should be identified on the Abstract page only. This is to help maintain the blind peer review policy of the journal.
- 3. The language of the journal is multilingual with English being the primary language, but any other language taught at the university level is acceptable, provided there is a translation of the article in English attached.
- 4. The documentation methods acceptable in this journal is the current APA style. The documentation style should be used in both in-text citations and on the Reference page. Furthermore, the article should be rich in literature with facts and adequate referencing Originally of thought of the author(s) is of paramount importance.
- 5. Tables and figures should be alluded to in the text while allusions to 'notes' should be indicated in superscripts in the body text. Explanation of the notes should be presented as endnotes at the end of the article, just before the Reference page.
- 6. Author(s) shall be responsible for securing any copyright waivers and permissions as may be needed to allow the use of copyrighted materials in their work. Articles submitted to RSUJOE shall be subject to plagiarism check, and only those that meet the acceptable threshold shall be published.
- 7. Any article submitted to RSUJOE shall attract \$15 USD (N4500.00) non-refundable fee for Paper Assessment and if the paper is accepted as meeting the requirements for Publication in RSUJOE, shall attract \$60 USD (N18,000) Page Fee and another \$15 USD (N5000.00) for hosting online. Submission deadlines for two editions of the Journal: 31st May for June Edition and 30th November for December Edition.
